A prime example of these partnerships is the ongoing support from Crayola Canada. 2018 marks the 30th anniversary of Crayola’s annual sale in support of the United Way. Crayola Canada believes that every person in the community deserves an opportunity for a quality and colourful life: “We are very fortunate that the annual Crayola Sale can assist children, youth, and adults in the City of Kawartha Lakes. The sale started simply as a yard sale with a few Crayola products added in. It was the beginning of a long-term relationship and, thanks to the efforts of countless volunteers from Crayola, the UWCKL, and the community, it has grown to its current form.”

Along with the 30th Annual Sale, 2018 marks another milestone in the partnership between United Way and Crayola Canada. The two teams have entered into a land use agreement to turn 30,000 sq. ft. of unused land at Crayola Canada into United Way CKL’s largest ever Community Garden! This garden will enhance the availability of fresh produce for programs such as the Good Food Box, collective kitchens, Meals on Wheels, cooking classes, food banks, and school nutrition programs. Other early partners in this project include:

- **Fleming College**, who will provide expertise, while also offering students unique learning opportunities through school projects and volunteering.
- **Bob Mark New Holland**, who will provide equipment and expertise as they volunteered their time and equipment for the first ground breaking in October of 2018 (pictured above).
- **Hill’s Florist and Greenhouses**, who will provide expertise on all things garden-related.
