

EDWIN BINNEY'S COMMUNITY GARDEN: FEEDING OUR COMMUNITY

Food from Edwin Binney's
Community Garden has been
delivered to ten food banks and
eleven agencies: some of which
are United Way CKL's regularly
funded agencies. In the first season
of operation, nearly **three tons of vegetables** were donated to the
following agencies:

More than 350 children from 15 different schools and summer camps were able to enjoy workshops at Edwin Binney's Community Garden in its first season of operation. Children ages 3-17 participated in workshops tailored to their ages and abilities: from plant-identification scavenger hunts, to creating garden-themed crafts, to discussing biology and agriculture systems.

Thanks to a **TD Friends of the Environment**Grant, United Way for the City of Kawartha
Lakes was able to hire an educator to
create curriculum-based workshop
materials.

"The scavenger hunt was a great hands-on way for the students to learn, discover, and apply their knowledge while getting to move the entire time.
